The IPCFRC EAPC Family Carer Reference Group will hold a parallel session at the upcoming 17th World Congress of the European Association for Palliative Care (EAPC 2021) on:

"Strategies to improve psychosocial wellbeing of family carers: How international collaborations make a difference"

The session is targeted at multidisciplinary health care workers and researchers who want to improve support for family carers, and aims to provide attendees with the following:

Erica Witkamp, *PhD* trained as a nurse and health scientist in the Netherlands. She has extensive experience in home care and palliative oncology care. She obtained her PhD in 2015 for her research into quality of dying in hospital. Erica works as an applied research professor at the Research Center Innovations in Care and as a senior lecturer in the Bachelor of Nursing Program at the Rotterdam University of Applied Sciences in the Netherlands. She is also a senior researcher at the Department of Public Health at Erasmus University Medical Center. Erica's work focuses on family caregivers of patients with severe chronic and/or terminal conditions. Erica is involved in various research projects aimed at improving support for family caregivers in dealing with the impact of disease on their relatives, as well as improving collaboration between family caregivers, patients and heath care professionals.
