#### **Recent Event**

The IPCFRC EAPC Family Carer Reference Group held a symposium on: "Strategies to improve psychosocial wellbeing of family carers: How international collaborations make a difference" at the recent 17<sup>th</sup> World Congress of the European Association for Palliative Care (EAPC 2021). A/Prof Nick Dionne-Odom (University of Alabama at Birmingham, USA) & Professor Gunn Grande (The University of Manchester, UK) chaired the session, which included the following presentations:

"Evidence synthesis of factors affecting family carers' psychological wellbeing" by Dr Tracey Shield and Professor Gunn Grande, The University of Manchester, UK.

"Supporting family carer decision-making in palliative dementia care" by Professor Kevin Brazil, Queen's University Belfast, UK.

"Key considerations when selecting family carer outcome measures" by A/Prof Nick Dionne-Odom, University of Alabama at Birmingham, USA.
