





San Diego County...


11,721 km² = 4,526 sq miles County = 3.1 million City = 1.25 million



San Diego County Mortality

- 2008 19,408 deaths
- 24.5 % Heart disease
- 24.3 % Cancer
 - 5.9% Alzheimer"sdisease
 - 5.8 % Cerebrovascular disease
 - 5.4% Chronic Lower Respiratory disease
 - 4.8 % Accidents

Medicare Hospice Benefit...

Capitated Daily Funding

Since 1982

Routine care ≈ \$140 / day Respite care ≈ \$140 / day (5 days) Inpatient care ≈ \$800 / day (costs \$1200-\$1400) Continuous / crisis care ≈ \$800 / day

...Medicare Hospice Benefit Covers






...SDH Hospice Care

 Avg. Census > 1,000 patients / day <u>500 – 550 / d</u> 9 branches Home care <u>300 – 350 / d</u> Long-term care 4 branches **3 Acute inpatient units** 36 beds 25 - 30 / d Pediatric team **Ambulatory outpatient clinic** <u>Team 7 – Px < 7 days</u> **Triage Nurses** Extended care – nights, weekends



SDH Non-Hospice Care...

- 4 hospital-based consult services each seeing 5-15 / day **UCSD Cancer Center La Jolla UCSD** Hillcrest **Scripps Mercy Hospital Scripps Chula Vista Hospital**
- Ambulatory outpatient clinics
- AIDS case management ≈ 120 / d



Outcomes... San Diego County

- 2008: 19,408 deaths
- % dying enroll in hospice
 - US ≈ 39 %
 - San Diego ≈ 70 %

Outcomes... San Diego vs. Los Angeles

	San Diego County	Los Angeles County
Use of Hospice Care	70 %	25 %
Cost of Hospice Care		50 % higher than San Diego County
Last 2 yrs of life	< \$29,000	> \$43,000




