## New Resource Launched for Family Carers

All Ireland Institute of Hospice and Palliative Care (AIIHPC) and Queen's University Belfast have developed a new resource to help carers providing support to a person who needs palliative care.

*Caring for Carers* is dedicated to providing core information for family members or friends who are providing support to a person who needs palliative care. The website was created by a team led by Professor Peter Hudson in collaboration with AIIHPC and a working group made up of family carers and former carers, carer organisations, health and social care professionals and charities. The site, hosted on [www.thepalliativehub.com](http://www.thepalliativehub.com) contains videos, downloads, links and information that has been created by a group of experts, including carers, from across the island of Ireland.

Speaking at the launch of the website, Karen Charnley, AIIHPC Head of Institute, said: "We are delighted to announce the launch of *Caring for Carers*, which represents another key stepping stone in providing information to the public on palliative care. Family carers play a huge and critical role in caring for people with palliative care needs and it is fitting we should launch this website during Carers Week 2017 which is dedicated to the amazing work that carers do on a daily basis."

Over the coming months *Caring for Carers* will continue to be developed with additional information and stories from people who have cared for or are caring for someone with palliative care needs.
